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Do you want to go to college? Are you willing to work hard in school? If you answered "YES" to these questions, then YOU should be in AVID!

What AVID is...

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- AVID is an acronym that stands for Advancement Via Individual Determination.
- AVID is an in-school academic support program that prepares students for college eligibility and success
- AVID is for all students, but it targets those in the academic middle, who may not be realizing their full potential academically.

What AVID isn't...

- AVID isn't a remediation or tutoring program.

You must be interviewed and accepted into the program. Students must commit to staying in the program for **all four years** and maintaining satisfactory grades.

In exchange for these commitments, your AVID teacher commits to preparing you for college, mentoring you through high school, and supporting you in your academic goals. There will also be opportunities each year to visit college campuses.
